Objectives:

This study examines the challenges of primary care professionals (PCP) in providing inter-disciplinary care for SD, particularly focusing on PCPs and specialists.

Key Points:

Gaps have been identified in the inter-disciplinary care of patients with SD. Performance improvement initiatives that address attitudes and team roles and responsibilities are needed.

Further, development of a recognized specialist pool is required to support primary care.
